

## Expanded access to the Journal of Visualized Experiments (JoVE) for the University of California

In support of UC's temporary shift to remote laboratory teaching, the California Digital Library (CDL) negotiation team, in consultation with UC campus library collections experts, secured expanded access to the [JoVE Video Journal](#) for all UC faculty, instructors, students, researchers, clinicians and staff. While JoVE, in response to COVID-19, has made a subset of its video collection freely available until mid-June, UC now has systemwide access to the entire JoVE portfolio through June 30, 2020.

JoVE includes over 11,000 videos in disciplines such as biology, chemistry, engineering, medicine, physics and psychology. [JoVE Science Education](#) consists of brief video demonstrations of labs and experiments to teach core scientific concepts. The peer-reviewed [JoVE Video Journal](#) offers videos on new experimental methods, techniques and protocols. JoVE videos can be viewed on their site or embedded into learning management systems.

Our campus library liaison is Jim Dooley, Head of Collections at the Library, and is available to assist faculty and instructors regarding JoVE.
